Shallow Water Guards are responsible for ensuring the smooth and safe operation of our rides, for the enjoyment of our guests. These employees can work in pools up to 4 feet deep and are also responsible for the cleanliness of their attraction and work area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Shallow Water guards work an average of 10-11 hours outside •Some positions are shaded and others are in direct sunlight •Team members are rotated every 30 minutes •Some positions are seated and others are standing or walking positions •Team members also assist with pushing rafts onto the slides and assisting guests at the bottom. •Team members assist with cleaning ride areas, pathways, eating areas, and bathrooms •Team members also move rafts and other ride vehicles throughout the day •If possible Team Members may be cross-trained as Area Hosts
Specific qualifications required:	<p>No prior experience necessary - all positions offered are entry level. : We are looking for team members with a positive attitude, lots of energy and an ability to make guest and kid-centered decisions. Applicants with flexible schedules increase their chances of obtaining the position of their choice.</p> <p>Students will have a swim test upon arrival. Shallow Water Guard positions are assigned as area host positions until swim test is complete and certified as Shallow Water Guard.</p> <p>Swimming qualifications: Swim – 100 yards, front crawl or breaststroke. Brick – 20 yards swim, 4-5 foot surface dive, retrieve 10 lbs brick, swim or walk 20 yards on back with both hands holding brick, and exit pool without using ladder steps. Complete in 50 seconds. Tread – Tread water without arms for 2 minutes. Scan – Identify 80% of objects in pool (8 out of 10 objects).</p>

See job offer provided at the hiring event for more information.</p> <p>The International Housing Village (IHV) is the private property of Busch Gardens where students working for BG/WCUSA live during their Work and Travel program.</p> <p>About 430 students live in the International Housing Village in peak season. Housing is dormitory style, with four persons sharing a room. Each room has individual beds, cable television, refrigerator, bathroom and shower, hot water, heat, air conditioning, free local telephone calls and access to international calls using phone cards. Hi-speed WiFi is available at the IHV. For safety there is IHV security and IHV staff to assist you at most times of the day and evening.</p> <p>Busch Gardens in Williamsburg is an action packed, European-themed park with 17th century charm and 21st century technology, boasting more than 300 acres of unparalleled fun and adventure for the entire family.</p> <p>Water Country USA, the mid-Atlantic's largest family water play park, features the world's latest, greatest, state-of-the-art water rides and attractions, spectacular entertainment, shopping and restaurants - all set to a colorful 1950's surf theme.</p> <p>BG/WCUSA International Work and Travel Program is best suited for students who are independent, open minded, reliable, mature and seeking a cultural experience.</p> <p>Housing is deducted from your paycheck biweekly at a daily rate of \$11/day in June, July and August and \$7/day in May and September.</p>
